By stressing the importance of kindness, open-mindedness, and valuing diversity in elementary school, we are creating a more inclusive and compassionate school environment and equipping our students with essential life skills. These values will be a foundation for their future success and contribute to a more harmonious society. We sincerely appreciate teachers, educators, and parents' support in reinforcing these messages at home and school, as our collaborative efforts will profoundly impact our children's development. Together, we can nurture the next generation of empathetic and open-minded individuals who embrace diversity and improve the world.

In our fifth-grade classrooms, our unit has revolved around valuing diversity and international-mindedness. Here are a few ways we can continue to support our young learners.

Kindness: The Foundation of Positive Relationships

- Teaching empathy: In elementary school, children are at a stage where they can develop a deeper understanding of others' feelings. Encourage them to put themselves in someone else's shoes and consider how their actions might affect others.
- Acts of kindness: Promote simple acts, such as helping a classmate with homework, sharing, or offering a friendly smile. These acts can create a positive and supportive school atmosphere.
- Role modeling: Teachers, educators, and parents can lead by example, showing kindness to their children and students, as well as to others. Discuss with your child or students how acts of kindness have a ripple effect, making the world a better place.

Valuing Diversity: Celebrating Our Differences

- Inclusive school environment: Ensure the school environment reflects students' diverse backgrounds and experiences. Incorporate books, lessons, and activities celebrating diversity and inclusivity in the curriculum.

- Role of parents: Discuss with your child the beauty and richness diversity brings to our world. Share stories and experiences that illustrate the importance of valuing diversity.
- Encourage friendships: Encourage your child or students to make friends with peers from different backgrounds. Promote playdates or activities that foster these friendships outside of school.

Parental and Educator Support: Strengthening the Message at Home and School

- Family and school discussions: Engage in conversations with your child or students about their experiences at school. Ask them about their interactions with classmates and teachers, and gently guide them toward kind, open-minded, and inclusive behaviors.
- Reading materials: Provide books and articles that promote kindness, open-mindedness, and diversity. Reading together as a family and discussing these topics in the classroom can spark meaningful discussions.
- Lead by example: As parents, educators, and teachers, be mindful of your own interactions and behaviors. Children learn a lot from observing the adults around them, and your actions and attitudes can profoundly impact them.

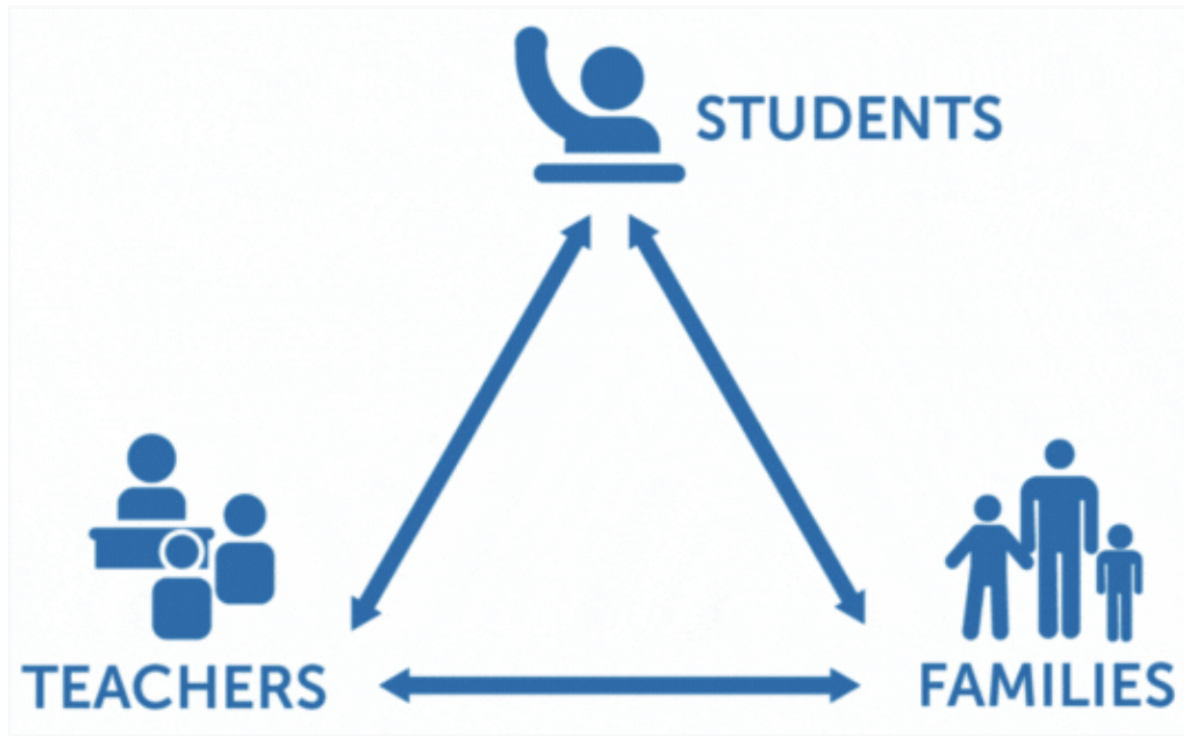

Three-way conferences involve the student, parents and teacher. Students discuss their learning and understanding with their parents and teachers, who are responsible for supporting the student through this process. Students are responsible for reflecting upon work samples they have chosen to share, that have been previously selected with guidance and support from the teacher and could be from the student's portfolio. The student, parents and the teacher collaborate to establish and identify the student's strengths and areas for improvement. This may lead to the setting of new goals, with all determining how they can support the achievement of the goals. The teacher is an integral part of the process and takes notes of the discussion. These notes may then be used in the written report. All of the participants must understand the format and their roles prior to the conference.

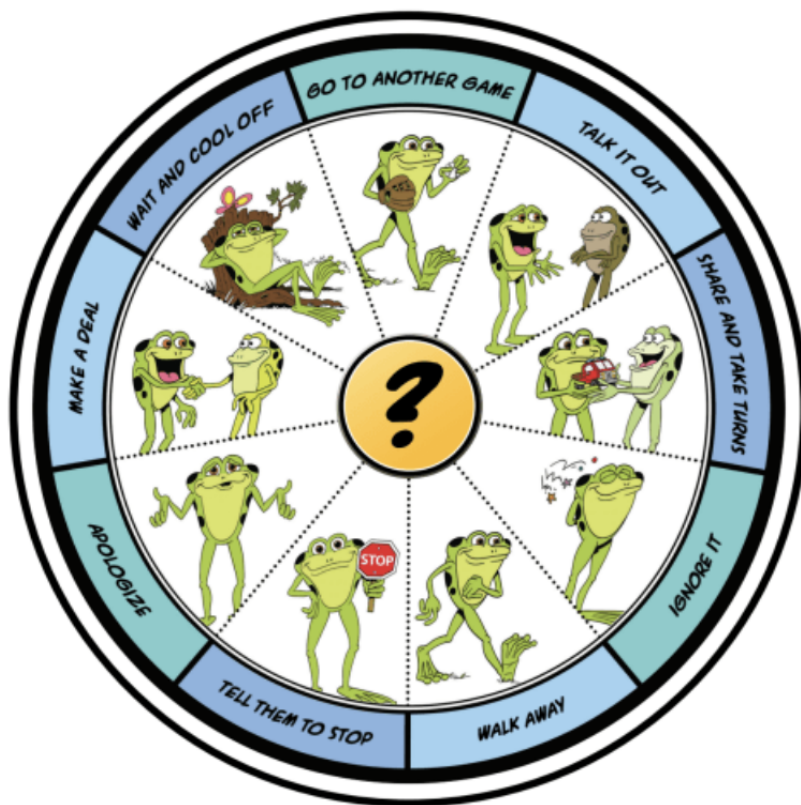

Kelso Choices

Dear families,

Over the next few weeks, in my role as the Wellbeing Coach, I will be introducing Kelso's Choices to our primary students. Kelso's Choices is a programme to support students solving small problems. A big problem is when someone is hurt or it is dangerous, in this case children need and should seek adult support. Conflict or disagreement is normal and often happens when children get together. However, hurtful words, gestures, or physical attack are unacceptable ways to deal with conflict and disagreement.

Our goal is to teach students several positive ways to deal with these difficult situations. To do this, we are asking students who have minor problems to try at least two of the following ideas:



By using this plan, we believe that our students will develop effective problem-solving skills that they can use again and again. It will help them to deal with conflict in a positive manner and to make appropriate decisions. Knowing what to do will help students reduce the stress and number of conflicts they have at school and at home.

Kelso's posters will be posted around the school and in classrooms too. We encourage you to become familiar with this program and use it in your

home. By working together, we can support our primary students to have effective conflict resolution strategies.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We hope this newsletter finds you well. As we navigate the journey of parenthood, one of the essential skills we must master is setting effective limits and boundaries for our primary-age children. In today's newsletter, we will explore how to establish boundaries without resorting to anger.

Why Setting Boundaries Matters

Boundaries are like road signs guiding children through the twists and turns of life. They provide a sense of safety, structure, and teach children about respect and responsibility. Effective boundaries help children understand what is expected of them and what behaviour is appropriate.

Tips for Setting Boundaries Without Anger

Consistency is Key:

Children thrive on routine and predictability. Establish clear and consistent boundaries so your child knows what to expect. When rules change frequently, confusion can lead to frustration.

Open Communication:

Talk to your child about the rules and boundaries you've set. Explain the reasons behind them, using age-appropriate language. Encourage questions and discussions, fostering a sense of understanding and cooperation.

Be a Role Model:

Children learn by example. Demonstrate the behaviour you want to see in your child. Model patience, respect, and self-control in your interactions with them and others.

Empathise and Validate:

When your child tests the boundaries (as they inevitably will), try to understand their perspective. Validate their feelings and let them know you understand their frustration or disappointment.

Set Realistic Expectations:

Age-appropriate expectations are crucial. Ensure that the boundaries you set are realistic for your child's developmental stage. Avoid setting them up for failure by expecting too much too soon.

Time-Out for Everyone:

Sometimes, both you and your child may need a break. If you feel anger or frustration building, take a step back, and revisit the situation when you're both calmer and can communicate more effectively.

Consequences, not Punishments:

Instead of punitive measures, focus on natural consequences. These consequences help children understand the direct impact of their actions without making them feel punished.

Seek Support When Needed:

If you find that you're struggling with setting boundaries or managing your emotions, don't hesitate to seek support from a counselor, therapist, or parenting support group. There's no shame in asking for help.

In the journey of parenting, it's important to remember that there is no perfect formula for setting boundaries, and there may be moments when we get it wrong. During these times, be kind to yourself, as mistakes are opportunities for growth, both for you and your child. What truly matters is your commitment to creating a loving and supportive environment where you and your child can learn and thrive together.
